Three new films can now be viewed on BIHR's website. These short documentaries tackle human rights issues affecting people in the UK today: access to the Metro transport system for mobility scooter users in Newcastle, parents with learning difficulties, and the smacking of children.

The films are part of the ISIS film project, a ground-breaking initiative run by BIHR and the Documentary Filmmakers Group, which gave free training in documentary production and human rights to sixteen talented women filmmakers.
